
If off-site habitat was protected, upload the required contract and continue to Slide 6. Remember that:

- The contract must include specific details about the type of support being provided, especially if the project team is providing labor services.
- If the project team is providing labor services, some labor must occur during the performance period, and your contract should very clearly include details about the amount and type of labor provided.
- If you are providing financial support, the contract must show that the off-site area was protected over the duration of the performance period.



NOTE: Although the credit form doesn't ask for it, consider providing a map showing the location of the off-site area. Precisely identifying the location the off-site habitat area will help the review team confirm compliance with the credit requirements.





Values in the white cells will automatically populate based on your entries. The "Total contributing area restored or protected" in the lower right cell must be equal to or greater than the "Required site area restored or protected" in the lower left cell to earn this credit.
